-SAFETY SIGNAGE TO BE POSTED on the fence in plain view for every one to see !!

Another sign to go next to these pictured here will be "DO NOT TAXI INTO THE PITS" As per our <u>Safety Code</u> (WEBSITE HYPERLINKS IN BLUE) [Section 3, Sub-Section I]

• Various present members at meeting have stated that they have done this very thing and will amend their ways and that it was an excellent reminder to have the signage! Also it will state precedence guideline for visiting clubs as well as new pilots in training.



- Discussions were held ... and it was a consensus agreement of the present membership that a plastic construction type barricade fence be put at the end of the taxiway pavement, during events as an extra precaution. This will not interfere with the club's mowing sub-contractor operations as it can be easily and temporarily removed and replaced.
 - *Safety Committee* is concerned that a runaway plane could endanger those in the pit area and by having a plastic construction type barricade fence that is flexible; it won't damage a plane, like a chain link fence would, in the event that the unforeseen happens.
 - *Safety Committee* reminds everyone that also out lined in [Section 5, Sub-Section A] that *No helicopter is to be flown out of the fixed wing pit area.*
 - Dallas, mentioned that every club member needs to be mindful and that no one ever says to someone that does this, or is in the act of doing such, "That your not to do _____." Safety should be on everyone's mind at all times and we should look out for everyone else's safety.

-BOD meeting to take place with Summit in February sometime this meeting is to introduce the new Board Of Director Officers to Summit personnel. Hopefully, we will receive the AWAS frequency during this meeting. The BOD will disclose the topics of the meeting afterwards in a special announcement after the meeting takes place.

-February BOD Meeting to be held Wednesday evening February 10th, discussions to include Wings Over Salem event planning, preparation, publicity and other pertinent club business.

Safety Highlights:

Not much flying was done due to the snow, however the *Safety Chair* recommends:

- → That you <u>do not</u> use DSM2TM receivers in your aircraft !
- Be mindful of spectator' locations and their safety.
- All members *please* review the <u>Safety Code</u> (<u>WEBSITE HYPERLINKS IN BLUE</u>) in its entirety.

Let's keep in mind that it's Summit's land & we are stewards of their property. It is a privilege to be here, therefore we need to respect their wishes and demands.

To be discussed at BOD meeting for planning

-Budget for 2016 that was posted in January Newsletter & on the website was presented for discussion and questions before submission to vote before the General Membership.

- NO line items in question
- > Other questions brought before the floor ...
 - How many members is the revenue figure based on?
 - Budgeted on \$9200 for dues and initiation fees for Budget 2016
 - → Member Roster consists of 89 Active, 4 Associate, & 6 Youth
 - How does the budget stack up to the revenue we took in last year?
 - Last calendar year \$9273, just slightly less by \$73. With no more budgeted spending than in 2015. We still have spending occurring until the end of the fiscal year [May April], per the Treasurer (i.e. early alert system).
 - → Are dues rising? ... NO THEY WILL REMAIN THE SAME ...
 - → \$98 IF PAID BEFORE MAY 1ST (MUST BE IN TREASURER'S HANDS) OTHERWISE \$108 ! IF NOT PAID BY JUNE 1ST THEN MEMBER MUST RE-APPLY AND PAY INITIATION FEE AGAIN !! *PLEASE PAY EARLY*
 - → You must be a Member in good standing and dues current with the AMA to fly at RVRC
- Jim motons the Budget for 2016 be passed as set forth before the General Membership
 Don seconds and the Budget is held to a vote and is passed unanimously

Old Business:

-FAA registration of our members, but since an AMA solution to the registration requirement is unlikely by the February 19th deadline, <u>*ALL*</u> members should register at www.faa.gov/uas/registration. Once registered pilots will receive a Federal registration number that is to be placed on or within aircraft over 250 grams (0.55 lbs.). Members are encouraged to continue placing their AMA numbers on their aircraft as well. Members only have to register once, they do not have to register each unique aircraft. The FAA requires registration regardless if you fly a multi-rotor, helicopter, fixed wing, or any other type of radio control model aircraft that uses a ground control system with a communication link, such as a transmitter.

- Air Warning Alert System (AWAS) in process of being installed, Jim explained we are waiting for a coordination frequency from Summit

-Field Clean Up Day scheduled for Saturday March, 26th; We need everyone's help as many hands make light work! Gary is getting a skid-steer tractor to help with brush removal.

-Newsletter Submission Date Change; Secretary has moved date to 2nd Monday of the Month preceding publication to enable an earlier and more timely distribution of the newsletter to the general membership. Office of the Secretary's goal is to have the Newsletter presented and posted to the website with in 7-10 days after the monthly General Membership Meeting.


Members did you know ...


After World War I many experienced fighter pilots were eager to show off their new skills. Many American pilots became Barnstormers, flying into small towns across the country and showing off their flying abilities, as well as taking paying passengers for rides. Eventually the Barnstormers grouped into more organized displays. Air shows sprang up around the country, with air races, acrobatic stunts, and feats of air superiority. The air races drove engine and airframe development — the Schneider Trophy, for example, led to a series of ever faster and sleeker monoplane designs culminating in the Supermarine S.6B
