

- **-Summit**; Gary, RVRC's President is trying once again to initiate a Board Of Director's meeting with John Milco, CEO of Summit, so that the new administration can meet face to face and iron our some particulars:
- Air Warning Alert System (AWAS) we are waiting for a coordination frequency from Summit; as the microprocessor receiver can be programmed. Jim Bowen has purchased a Uniden BC356CRS Radio Scanner & has added a signal detect output to the receiver. We will need that to feed to the pattern recognizer which will in turn activate the alarm and strobe.
- → Approach Flight Pattern we are waiting for a details on an approach vector and fly by so we are aware of pilot's intentions.
 - Summit's Flight Operations is bringing in a Cesna182 as pilot transport vehicle and it will now be housed in the Hangar that Al James use to house his C182. - **-FAA registration** of our members, *the February 19th deadline HAS PASSED*, *ALL* members should be registered at www.faa.gov/uas/registration. Once registered pilots will receive a Federal registration number that is to be placed on or within aircraft over 250 grams (0.55 lbs.). Members are encouraged to continue placing their AMA numbers on their aircraft as well. Members only have to register once, they do not have to register each unique aircraft. The FAA requires registration regardless if you fly a multi-rotor, helicopter, fixed wing, or any other type of radio control model aircraft that uses a ground control system with a communication link, such as a transmitter.


Old Business:

 - Extra visiting crowds coming into the area for the Blue Ridge Bike Festival on this particular weekend (Thursday Sunday).
 - WE NEED A Public Address SYSTEM if anyone know where we can get one please let the board know.

Safety Highlights:

- → **Do not** use DSM2TM receivers in your aircraft!
- Be mindful of spectator' locations and their safety.
- All members *please* review the **Safety Code** (WEBSITE HYPERLINKS IN BLUE) in its entirety.
- Large War-Birds and Jet Pilots especially, but all pilots should, start practicing using an Immelmann Turn at the East End of the Field and Runway strip. This should be performed now so as to keep all R/C Aircraft away from the Cessna C182 Hangar and away from ALL buildings.
 - If you don't know how to perform this maneuver ... it is explained below:
 - > Fly the plane straight on level flight Step A
 - > Start with 90 degree half-roll climb up using up-elevator until the plane is head back to the opposite direction Step B
 - > Keep the plane in straight and level inverted flight.
 - ➤ Half-turn the plane to a normal flying position using aileron, you will now be heading opposite to the first direction but gaining higher altitude. Step D
 - This picture shows how the Immelmann turn is done.



Pro Tips:

- *When you are comfortable with this maneuver, start matching the speed of the half roll to the height of the half loop. If your roll is short, slow down the half roll to add symmetry to the two components.
- # A tight half loop will make the maneuver much smaller but will provide greater exit speed!

-Models of the Month:

-Don Peterson presented a Pat Fiddle short kit that he built from which he did a lot of his own interpretation from and says that it is as light as a feather! It took a lot of time to align the nodules for the motors and is powered by three 250 size electric motors. He stated that the instructions told him to use a 2-cell but when he did the motors turned and then stopped so he used a 3 cell and all was well as the motors kept turning.

Members did you know ...

The Model of the Month submission by Don Peterson reminded me of the FORD 4-AT Trimotor Passenger Transport Airline Aircraft. Henry Ford drew inspiration from the German design of a Fokker F.VIIa-3m and in 1925 he he took over a small aircraft manufacturing company, the Stout Metal Airplane Company, with the intention of widening his business interest by extending his activities into the aeronautical industry. Between June 1927 & June 1933, 194 Ford 4-AT left the assembly lines, and these airplanes nicknamed the Tin Goose, were used nearly all the major U.S. airlines and played a considerable partinn the development of the vase North American system of domestic routes.

The Ford 4-AT was operated by many individuals and small airlines in countries (including Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, Europe, Australia and even China).
